



The Air America vanity U.S. postage stamp

The Air America wings vanity postage stamp has been created to celebrate Air America's service to the nation. The 39-cent U.S. postage stamp also honors the service of the former employees of Civil Air Transport, Air America, Air Asia Company Limited, and Southern Air Transport.

The art work for the stamp was the creation of Geoff Herrington, the son of the late Air America pilot Frank Herrington. We are indebted to Geoff for his work on this beautiful stamp.

The date 1947 signifies the beginning of these grand aviation enterprises with the organization of Civil Air Transport by Gen. Claire L. Chennault, and Whiting Willauer. Air America, the surviving entity of these aviation enterprises, flew many of the last flights out of South Vietnam at the end of the Vietnam conflict in 1975.

Dan Gamelin will have the Air America 39-cent vanity stamp for sale in the Air America store. Because this is a vanity postage stamp, the cost of the stamp is more expensive than those issued by the U.S. Postal Service.
